DR. RENATO KASSEROLLER, MEDICAL DIRECTOR OF THE DR. VODDER SCHOOLS

Dear Therapists,

In past years, at the end of the classes, I always offered to the students the opportunity to call me if there were some medical problems. Due to the increase in certified therapists and my absences from Walchsee because of courses and congresses, it has become more and more unreasonable. I am still of the opinion that it is very important for therapists to get information when it's needed. The Dr. Vodder Schools want to support you, and will publish newsletters in the future.

My input will be information about the news from scientific lymphological world. At the last review in Walchsee, I presented to participants all the news from the last two years. In the next weeks I am visiting numerous congresses in Europe to see what is developing and I will inform you about the latest research in my next letter.

We are preparing a new classification for lymphedema involving a combination of volume and fibrosis measured by skin folds.

REPORT

D r. Kasseroller gave a report at the ISL Conference last year, of a long-term retrospective study he has carried out at the Dr. Vodder Clinic in Austria. He analysed the results of the treatment of 553 patients with lymphedema.

In the study, 291 patients presented with unilateral mastectomy, axillary dissection and partial radiation. 202 patients presented with lower extremity edema after gynaecological or urological surgery with lymph node dissection. 60 patients presented with primary lymph edema.

A total of 996 therapy cycles were performed on the patients with the average cycle lasting 16.75 days.

The average improvement for arm edema was 46% and for legs 41%.

Dr. Kasseroller found that the optimal time for a second therapy cycle for a patient was 20 weeks after the first cycle. During this time, no deterioration of the edema was observed. An interval of 20 - 50 weeks showed only some minor disadvantages to the patients. An interval of more than 50 weeks showed a clear disadvantage for the patient, in terms of a worsening of the edema.

1999 RECERTIFICATION AND THERAPY II & III

n 1999 we have planned two Reviews so far. One will be in the USA, in Stowe, Vermont, and one in Canada, in Victoria, British Columbia. The dates are:

June 12 – 14, Stowe, VT July 30 – August 01, Victoria, BC

These Reviews for therapists will be separate from the Therapy II and III classes and each is a two and a half-day event. We are looking forward to having Dr. Kasseroller and Prof. Dr. Weissleder speak at both events, as well as Dr. Kasseroller and Hildegard Wittlinger. We invite you to make case presentations at the Review and look forward to hearing more about the work you are doing. A registration form is enclosed if you are planning on taking the recertification in 1999.

There are three Therapy II and III classes planned in North America next year. One will follow each of the Reviews and in addition there will be a class in November in Victoria. The dates are as follows:

June 14 – 25, Stowe, Vermont August 01 – 13, Victoria, BC October 31 – November 12, Victoria, BC

A Therapy II and III is also planned for English-speaking therapists in Walchsee, Austria, August 23 – September 03.

NAVALT DECISION

he Board of NAVALT decided in May this year not to hold an Annual Members meeting in conjunction with the Dr. Vodder School Review in 1999. The Board has also proposed a by-law change, to drop the requirement that therapists be currently certified with the Dr. Vodder School in order to be placed on the NAVALT referral list. Both the Dr. Vodder School – North America and the Dr. Vodder Schule – Walchsee are opposed to this move and we ask that you read our response before making your decision, if you are a voting member of NAVALT.

CURRENTLY CERTIFIED THERAPIST

If you have taken your training with the School within the past two years or have attended a recertification class, your name will be on the currently certified therapist list. We will give out your name for referrals and in a sense, you are the ambassadors of the Dr. Vodder School. We know that by maintaining your certification, you have invested in your MLD /CDT skills and we have confidence in your abilities. There are approximately 400 therapists currently certified with the Dr. Vodder School in North America.

One question we are often asked is if I took my training for example, in June of one year, will my certification expire in June, two years later. The answer is no because your certification is for the calendar year. If you took your training in say June 1996, your certification would be valid until

December 31 1998. We realize that therapists may not be able to attend a recertification exactly on the two-year anniversary.

As mentioned in Sondra's column, we would like to place the currently certified therapist list on the Web page, which should greatly increase your exposure. We will be able to up-date this easily, as soon as you have completed your recertification.

IN OTHER NEWS

NEW TEXTBOOK FROM DR. KASSEROLLER

The English version of Dr. Kasseroller's textbook is now being printed by Haug publishers and should be available shortly. It is called 'Compendium of Manual Lymph Drainage' and accompanies all levels of the therapist training. It has many photographs of patients and touches on all aspects of the Therapy training. It provides students with another perspective from the books by Dr. Kurz. This book is available from the School and the cost is \$29.95 US plus shipping & handling or in Canada, \$45.00 CDN plus shipping & handling.

NLN CONFERENCE

any of our therapists were able to attend the recent NLN conference in San Francisco and it is estimated that about 500 people attended. Five of the Dr. Vodder School teachers were present and Kathryn Thrift and Robert Harris gave workshops for health care practitioners, on the Dr. Vodder method of Manual Lymph Drainage, assisted by therapists and instructors from the Dr. Vodder School. Robert Harris gave a talk to the whole conference on the Dr. Vodder method. In total, nine of the workshops and talks given at the conference were from Dr. Vodder School graduates. The conference itself was organized into two separate programs, one for patients and one for health care practitioners. There were talks on many differing aspects of lymphedema including the physiology and pathophysiology of the lymph system, effects of primary and secondary lymphedema, management of lymphedema, research perspectives, effects of cancer therapy, surgical intervention and lymphatic imaging. There were also talks on complications of lymphedema, controversies and case study presentations. The keynote speaker was Prof. Dr. Michael Foeldi of Germany. Discussions also took place, concerning a proposed "National Certification", organized by the NLN for

lymphedema therapists. A trial exam had been prepared with exam questions provided by Robert Harris, Jo Zuther (Lerner) and Dr. Joe Feldman. About 80 people volunteered to take this exam in order to see how viable such an exam might be. Next year, it has been proposed to do a bigger trial exam with a larger group of therapists, and we will keep you informed on this process as it develops.

ULM CONFERENCE

O ne of the main events in the Dr. Vodder Schule – Walchsee calendar has been the biennial conference of the Dr. Vodder Society for Manual Lymph Drainage. This has provided a platform for researchers and therapists to share their most recent findings and the papers from this conference are published. The conference has in the past, been held in Baden-Baden but this year, will be held in Ulm, Germany at the end of October. Prof. Hutzschenreuter is the chairperson of the conference, which will be held at the University of Ulm and the theme this year is Whiplash.

INTERNATIONAL SOCIETY OF LYMPHOLOGY CONFERENCE, MADRAS, INDIA.

STUDY FROM ROYAL MARSDEN HOSPITAL, UK

A recently completed, 4-year study at the Royal Marsden Hospital compared the Dr. Vodder method of MLD alone, performed by Dr. Vodder School therapists, and self-administered massage (SAM) on a group of lymphedema patients.

It found that MLD alone caused a significant reduction in volume whereas SAM did not. The study also showed a significant decrease in caliper creep measurements. Caliper creep shows the degree of edema present. A highly edematous tissue will deform to a greater extent under the sustained pressure of a caliper than a non-edematous tissue.

MLD alone also significantly reduced the dermal depth at the deltoid area which indicates a reduction in edema. In a Quality of Life questionnaire, MLD significantly improved emotional function (reducing worry, irritability, tension, depression) and sleep disturbance. MLD alone also was significantly more likely than SAM to reduce pain, discomfort, heaviness, fullness, bursting and hardness.

The study will be published and a reference will be given, as soon as it becomes available.

COMPRESSION GARMENT ARTICLES

Two special abstract articles have been published in English with excellent colour photographs, about garments used in lymphedema care. If you have encountered problems with garments and finding suitable garments for unusual-shaped edema, these articles should help. They were originally published in German in the Journal: Vasomed, a scientific journal of Vascular Disease. One is entitled:

"Incorrect Compression Stockings in Lymphedema" by A. Vollmer, Special Abstract 5/96

The other is titled:

"Speciality Care of Atypical Lymphoedema Forms with Compression Stockings and Tights" by A. Vollmer, Special Abstract 5/96
